Are there any free tables?
I phoned you earlier.
Only me. / Just for one, please.
Two, please.
We are four.
Can I have a table for three?
Smoking / Non-smoking, please.
By the window, please.
I'd like a quiet table, please.
Can I see the menu / the wine list / the dessert menu, please?
Can I see the menu again, please?
Ok, I'll / We'll go somewhere else.
How long will it take?
No, no at all.
That's fine with me.

Useful phrases for the receptionist (not in soundtrack)

My name is ... and I'm your waiter (Br.) / server (Am.) this afternoon / evening.

Here is the menu.
Would you like the wine list?
What would you like to drink?

Are you ready to order?
What would you like to have?

Any starter / appetizer?

## When ordering food, the customer may say:

Thank you.
Yes, please.
No, thank you, I'm fine.
Not yet. Could you come back in a minute?
What do you recommend?
I'll think about it.
I'll take that.
I'like
... a beer
... a glass of red / white wine /
champagne / sparkling wine
... a bottle of some mineral water
... sparkling mineral water (BrE) /
mineral water with gas (AmE)
... still (BrE) mineral water /
mineral water without gas (AmE)
... to start with
... as the main course
... for dessert
... a green salad / tomato and onion salad
... a chicken / corn / vegetable soup
... a shrimp cocktail
... a steak
... some fish
... some chicken
... something light
... an apple pie
... strawberries and ice-cream
I'm a vegetarian.
I'm afraid I can't eat...
What is the ... made of?

## DISCUSSING THE MEAL

Useful phrases for the receptionist (not in soundtrack)

Is everything alright?
How's everything?
How is your meal?

Are you done?
Would you like anything else?

## The customer may say:

Everything's just fine.
It's very good / excellent / delicious.
Yes, could I have some...
No, thank you. I'm fine.
Can I have afork / spoon / knife / glass, please?
... some salt and pepper ...
... tomato sauce, please.
This is not what I ordered.

## I am afraid ...

... this does not taste very good.
... my meal is cold.
...there is too much salt / sugar / pepper in this.
This is too rare.
The steak is too rare / well-done / tough.
The music is too loud
There is too much noise.
Can we change the table, please?
Can you clean this table, please?

## PAYING THE BILL / THE CHECK

## The customer may say:

Can I have the bill (BrE) / check (AmE), please?
I'd like to pay.
Do you take credit cards?
Do you take traveller's cheques?
We'd like to pay separately.
Is service included?
How much is it?
You can keep the change.
The food was delicious / excellent.
My compliments to the chef.

Useful phrases for the receptionist (not in soundtrack)
No problem.
Just a minute.
Thank you, I'll tell the kitchen / the chef.
