When arriving at the restaurant, the customer may say:

Yes, my name is... I have a reservation by the name... I haven't got a reservation. Are there any free tables? I phoned you earlier. Only me. / Just for one, please. Two, please. We are four. Can I have a table for three? Smoking / Non-smoking, please. *By the window, please.* I'd like a quiet table, please. Can I see the menu / the wine list / the dessert menu, please? Can I see the menu again, please? *Ok, I'll / We'll go somewhere else. How long will it take?* No, no at all. That's fine with me.

DISCUSSING THE MEAL

Useful phrases for the receptionist (not in soundtrack)

Is everything alright? How's everything? How is your meal? Are you done? Would you like anything else?

The customer may say:

Everything's just fine. It's very good / excellent / delicious. Yes, could I have some...

No, thank you. I'm fine.

Can I have a fork / spoon / knife / glass, please?

... some salt and pepper ...

... tomato sauce, please.

This is not what I ordered.

I am afraid ...

... this does not taste very good. ... my meal is cold. ...there is too much salt / sugar / pepper in this. This is too rare. The steak is too rare / well-done / tough. The music is too loud There is too much noise. Can we change the table, please? Can you clean this table, please?

PAYING THE BILL / THE CHECK

The customer may say:

Can I have the bill (BrE) / check (AmE), please? I'd like to pay. Do you take credit cards? Do you take traveller's cheques? We'd like to pay separately. Is service included? How much is it? You can keep the change. The food was delicious / excellent. My compliments to the chef.

Useful phrases for the receptionist (not in soundtrack)

No problem. Just a minute. Thank you, I'll tell the kitchen / the chef.
